- Leading the nation as number **1** in percentage of trained volunteer leaders

These numbers help to show the broad scope of Scouting's reach in our area and the rich Scouting heritage in the Minsi Trails Council. Our continuous growth is due to our dedicated volunteer leaders, chartered partners, conscientious donors, and parents who give so much of their time and resources to help Today's Scouts become Tomorrow's Leaders.

In the past year, the Minsi Trails Council earned the National Centennial Quality Council Award, a recognition from the Boy Scouts of America that is reserved for only the top performing Scout Councils in the country. The award recognizes the Council for its operational excellence in delivering a quality program to the youth we serve. During 2007 the Minsi Trails Council was also recognized as the top Scout Council nationally in percentage of trained leaders (more than twice the national average).

In short, the Council was recognized for its leadership and that's what Scouting is all about...helping youth realize their full leadership ability and develop the character to act in a caring and responsible way towards others. # Scouting Solves Problems...

Today's youth face many challenges and influences competing for their time. Consider the issues facing youth and how they can be addressed through Scouting:

Youth Issues/Topics	Scouting Activities
1 Child obesity	Personal fitness; nutrition, exercise (hiking, swimming, bicycling)
2 Alcohol/drug abuse	Participation in Scouting's anti-drug program
3 Emergency preparedness	Disaster training and first aid/lifesaving skills training
4 Leadership	Leading Scout patrols, running meetings, planning events
5 Character	Learning and living the Scout Oath and Law
6 Family values	Scouting is a family-based program involving parents and youth
7 Diversity/tolerance	Helping Scouts with physical and mental disabilities
8 Environmentalism	"Leave No Trace" training
9 Community service	Service projects, Scouting For Food (food drive), Eagle Scout projects
10 Youth achievement	Scout rank advancement, merit badges and improved academics
11 Mentoring	Positive adult role models and their impact on young lives
12 Civic involvement	Citizenship training, flag ceremonies

Scouting gives youth the opportunity to break these trends in an environment where they are encouraged by a positive peer group. Participation in Scouting provides youth with many character development and leadership opportunities that are not available through other types of activities.

## Delivers Positive Results...

Scouting produces positive results and helps build tomorrow's leaders. Studies show that long-term youth participation in Scouting leads to:

- higher high school graduation rates...92% for Scouts vs. an average of 87% for non-Scouts
- higher college graduation rates...35% for Scouts vs. an average of 19% for non-Scouts
- earning 30% higher average household incomes as adults
- believing that others should come before self-interest
- valuing education and the environment
- being more involved and engaged in community activities as an adult

Simply stated, Scouting helps build character, leadership, communities, and families.



# Scouting Helps Our Communities...

The Scouts and leaders of the Minsi Trails Council contribute an estimated 1,000,000 hours annually. In addition, the 226 Eagle Scouts from the class of 2007 contributed more than 42,600 hours to major service projects in their local communities!

Scout volunteers make a significant, positive impact in all the communities in which they live. For almost 20 years the local **Scouting For Food** drive helped fill the shelves of food banks just in time to brighten the holidays for many of our less fortunate neighbors. Last year nearly 6,000 local Scouts distributed 250,000 empty grocery bags during November and then returned a week later to collect the filled bags for delivery to the food banks. In 2007 the Minsi Trails Council's Scouting for Food drive generated more than 200,000 pounds of food...enough food to feed more than 7,000 people for a week.

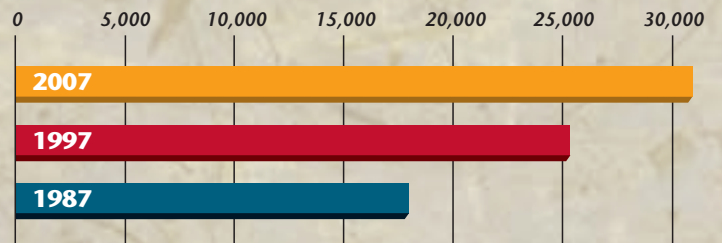
## Membership

# Scouting Programs

**Cub Scouting** is a family and home centered program for boys in 1st through 5th grades. Cub Scouting's emphasis is on quality, age-appropriate programs delivered at the neighborhood level.

**Boy Scouting** is a program for boys ages 11 – 17, designed to achieve the aims of Scouting through a vigorous outdoor program and peer-group leadership, building character, independence and responsibility in young people.

**Venturing** is a co-ed program for young men and women ages 14 – 20. It includes challenging high-adventure activities giving teenagers an opportunity to learn and grow in a fun, supportive, and high-adventure environment.

**Learning for Life** is a co-ed, school-based program for children in grades K through 12. Learning for Life helps develop social skills and career awareness in the classroom.

**Exploring**, a division of Learning for Life, offers a co-ed program for teenagers focused on learning about specific career interests by mentoring with local businesses, professionals, and industry leaders through worksite-based programs.

**Scoutreach**, the mission of Scoutreach (formerly Urban Scouting) in the Minsi Trails Council is to ensure that Scouting is available to all youth, regardless of who they are, where they live, their culture or economic ability. Scoutreach is an after-school program that provides a safe environment for young people to gain the character

and leadership development benefits of Scouting right in their own schools. Since 2002, Scoutreach has more than tripled in size, now serving over 1,400 young people.

## Camping

Our council is proud of its three resident camp facilities spread over more than 2,000 acres in the beautiful Pocono Mountains. With our council's strong focus on outdoor experience, more than 10,000 Scouts participated in camping programs last year, working on a variety of merit badges, teamwork activities, personal development, and most importantly, having fun. Even winter is prime camping season for our Scouts.

Camping is a critical aspect of the council's strategic vision for today's youth. Through the **Fulfilling the Promise** capital campaign, the council's camp facilities at Trexler Scout Reservation and Camp Minsi are being expanded to serve more youth and updated to provide an even more enjoyable camping experience. Dining halls and kitchens at all the camps were expanded to accommodate more campers and modernized for more efficient food preparation. Waterfront areas, where all the swimming, boating and water-safety training activities take place, were updated with new swim docks, beaches and recreation equipment. These completed projects greatly enhanced the camping experience and were only made possible through the generous contributions to the **Fulfilling the Promise** capital campaign.

## Fundraising

The Minsi Trails Council concluded the public phase of the **Fulfilling the Promise** capital campaign during 2007 while continuing our **Friends of Scouting** fundraising efforts. Both campaigns benefited from tremendous community support throughout the year and we thank all the individuals, organizations, companies, and foundations that support our Scouting programs.

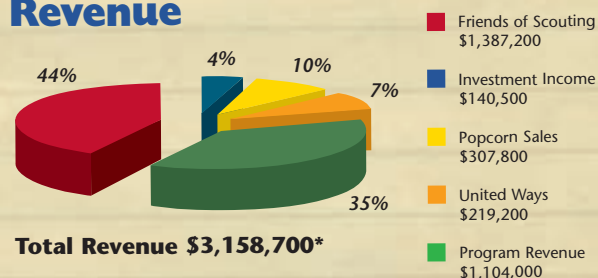
The community phase of the **Fulfilling the Promise** capital campaign generated \$5.5 million and achieved 100% of the target for this phase of the campaign...a great show of support from the communities that we serve. The \$2.5 million phase for remediation work on the dam at the 360 acre Stillwater Lake is being pursued through potential local, state and federal partnership opportunities.

Our **Friends of Scouting** campaign, with nearly 3,500 families and individuals contributing, generated more than \$957,000 to support quality Scouting programs in our council. Additionally, special fundraising events honored a number of outstanding community leaders for their dedication to Scouting and successfully generated nearly \$496,500.

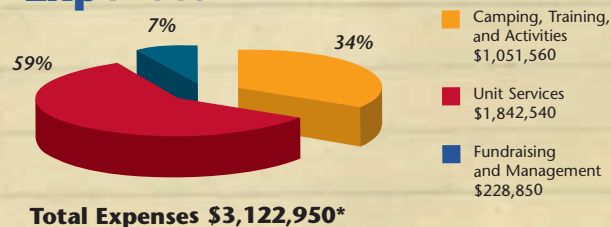
## Financial Statement

2007 was a year of solid investment in Scouting programs where the council expanded youth program support and generated a modest operating surplus. As the charts demonstrate, revenue was primarily generated through Friends of Scouting, program revenue, popcorn sales and United Way funding. On the expense side, 93% of expenses were attributable to our programs and unit services while only 7% was for fundraising efforts. The overall cost of Scouting at roughly \$100 per Scout remained relatively flat with prior years.
